Read: Romans 1:18-2:4

At the center of Paul's message is the idea of suppressing the truth about God. Are there any truths about God that you try to suppress? What does that end up looking like in your life?

How can Christians speak to sin without becoming judgmental?

Paul talks about God's kindness leading us to repentance. Where do you see God's kindness in this chapter? Can you think of a time where God's kindness has led to a change in your own life?

What does it change when you think of Christ experiencing God's wrath?

Spend some time thanking God and giving glory to him for who he is and what he has done.
