**Read Joshua 5:13-6:27**

Many scholars see Joshua's encounter with the commander of God's armies as an encounter with Christ himself. What about the scene would support that? Does that change how you read the story?

The commander would not take sides the way Joshua wanted. What difference does it make to ask whether or not we are on God's side rather than if he is on ours?

The people of Israel had to wait on God to bring down the walls rather than attack the city themselves. Scripture often says to wait on God. How do you know the difference between waiting and stalling?

Read Psalm 27:13-14. Is there anything you are waiting on God to answer for you right now? What have you been learning in the waiting?

Jericho speaks to the devastation of God's judgment on sin. How does the picture of what happened there inform your understanding of the judgment Christ endured on our behalf?
